Setting up your system

- ❖ Read and follow all instructions in the documentation before operating your system.
- ❖ Do not use this product near water or a heat source such as a radiator.
- ❖ Set up the system on a stable surface with the provided stand. Never use the system alone without the stand.

Getting to know your ZOTAC ZBOX

Front view



Refer to the diagram below to identify the components on this side of the system

1. Power switch

The power switch allows powering ON and OFF the system.

2. Headphone/Audio Out jack

The stereo headphone jack (3.5mm) is used to connect the system's audio out signal to amplified speakers or headphones.

3. Memory card slot

The Memory card slot is compatible with SD/SDHC/SDXC/UHS-II cards used in devices like digital cameras, MP3 players, mobile phones and PDAs.

4. Power LED

The Power LED is always ON when power is on.

5. WiFi LED

The WiFi LED is always ON when WiFi was active.

6. Hard disk LED

The hard disk LED blinks when data is being written into or read from the hard disk drive.

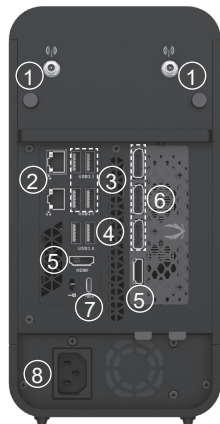
7. USB 3.0 ports

The USB 3.0 port supports the SuperSpeed USB 3.0 devices and is backwards compatible with USB 2.0/1.1 devices. Use this port for USB 3.0 devices for maximum performance with USB 3.0 compatible devices.

8. USB 3.0 Type-C port

The USB 3.0 type-C port supports the SuperSpeed USB 3.0 devices. Use this port for USB 3.0 devices for maximum performance with USB 3.0 compatible devices.

Rear view



Refer to the diagram below to identify the components on this side of the system.

1. WiFi antenna connectors

The WiFi antenna connector supports WiFi antenna module.

2. LAN ports

The eight-pin RJ-45 LAN ports support standard Ethernet cables for connection to a local network. The LAN port marked with K is for Killer Ethernet.

3. USB 3.1 port

The USB 3.1 port supports the SuperSpeed USB 3.1 devices and is backwards compatible with USB 3.0/2.0/1.1 devices. Use this port for USB 3.1 devices for maximum performance with USB 3.1 compatible devices.

4. USB 3.0 ports

The USB 3.0 port supports the SuperSpeed USB 3.0 devices and is backwards compatible with USB 2.0/1.1 devices. Use this port for USB 3.0 devices for maximum performance with USB 3.0 compatible devices.

5. HDMI ports

The HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) port supports a UHD device such as an LCD TV or monitor to allow viewing on a larger external display.

6. DisplayPorts

DisplayPort supports both external (box-to-box) and internal (laptop LCD panel) display connections.

7. Thunderbolt 4 port

The Thunderbolt 4 port is compatible with Thunderbolt 4 device such as external graphics, DisplayPort device and USB Type-C device.

8. Power input (AC 100-240V, 50-60Hz)

Connected with power cord to mains for AC input.

Installing Hardware

Before installing hardware, please follow the instructions below to remove the cover of your ZOTAC ZBOX.

1. Lay the ZOTAC ZBOX on a flat surface.
2. Locate the two thumb screws and remove.



3. Press down on the arrow of top cover and remove the top cover off the ZOTAC ZBOX in the direction of the arrow.



4. Push up and remove the two side covers.



Installing a graphics card (optional)

1. Remove the screw from the bracket. (tool required, not included)

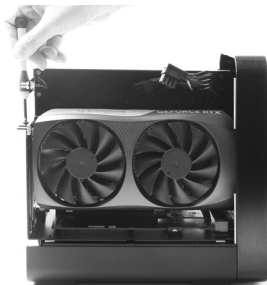


2. Insert the graphics card into the available PCIe slot.



*Graphics card compatibility - Power: up to 220W, Width: dual-slot, Length: 230mm / 9.06in

3. Install the screw to secure the graphics card.



4. Connect the power cable to the graphics card.

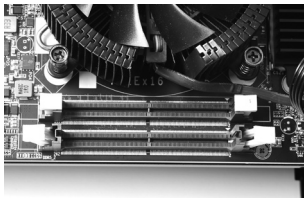


Installing a memory module

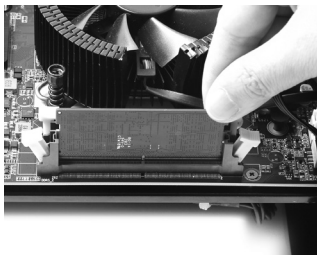
1. Lay the ZOTAC ZBOX on a flat surface with the right side upwards.



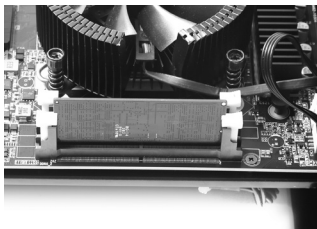
2. Gently push down on the memory retainer clips to the open position.



3. Insert a SO-DIMM memory module into the slot.



4. Gently push the SO-DIMM memory module down into the slot until the retainer clips lock into place.



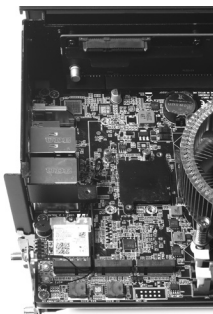
Note: This ZOTAC ZBOX accommodates two DDR5 SO-DIMM memory modules. You must install at least one module for the system to function.

Installing M.2 SSD module

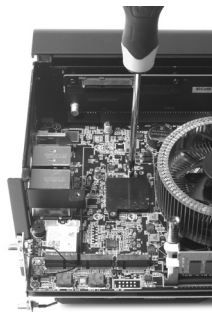
1. Remove the screw securing the hard disk bracket.



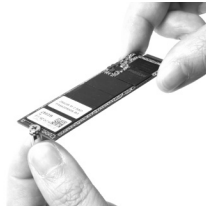
2. Remove the hard disk bracket.



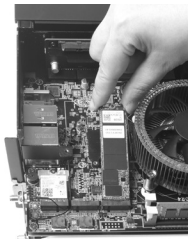
3. Locate the M.2 PCIe x4 / SATA SSD slot and remove the screw from the screw bolt.
(tool required, not included)



4. Attach the screw to the M.2 PCIe x4 / SATA SSD module.



5. Insert the M.2 PCIe x4 / SATA SSD module into the slot at a 45 degree angle.



6. Gently press down on the M.2 PCIe x4 / SATA SSD module, and install the screw.

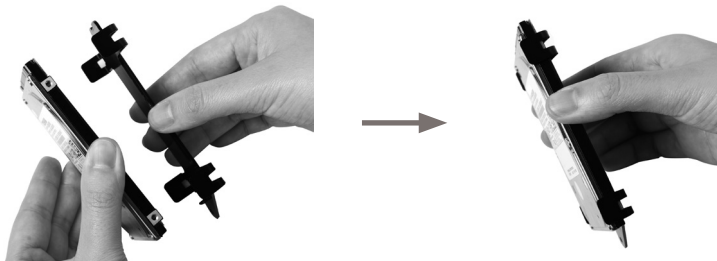


Installing a hard disk / SSD

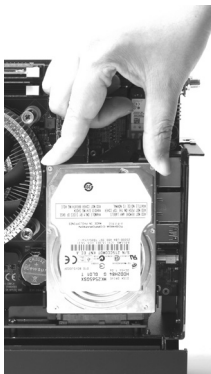
1. Locate the 2.5-inch SATA hard disk / SSD and the hard disk bracket.



2. Install the hard disk / SSD to the hard disk bracket.



3. Insert the hard disk bracket into the SATA slot.

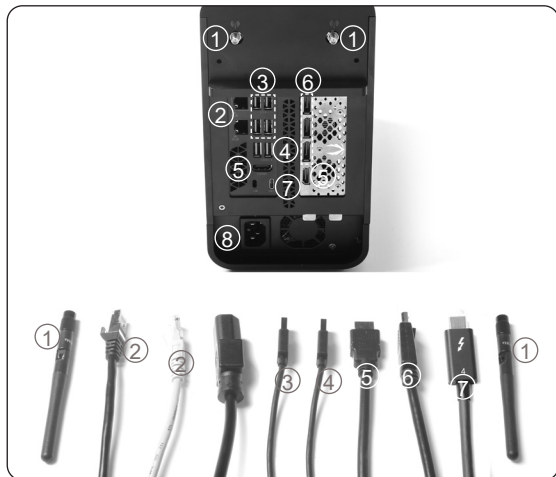


4. Reinstall the thumb screw.



Setting up your ZOTAC ZBOX

You need to connect peripherals before using your ZOTAC ZBOX.



1. Connecting a WiFi antenna module

Connect a BT/WiFi antenna module to the BT/WiFi antenna connector.

2. Connecting to a network device

Connect one end of a network cable to the LAN port on the system rear panel and the other End to a hub or switch. The LAN port marked with K is for Killer Ethernet.

3. Connecting to USB 3.1 devices

Connect USB 3.1 devices such as external hard disk drives, SSDs and flash drives to the USB 3.1 port on the system rear panel.

4. Connecting to USB 3.0 devices

Connect USB 3.0 devices such as external hard drives, SSDs and flash drives to the USB 3.0 port on the system rear panel.

5. Connecting to HDMI displays

Connect one end of an HDMI cable to the HDMI port on the system rear panel and the other end to a HDMI-compatible display such as an HDTV or monitor.

6. Connecting to DisplayPort displays

Connect the DisplayPort connectors to the DP port of the monitor or display.

7. Connecting to Thunderbolt devices

Connect the Thunderbolt devices such as external graphics, DisplayPort device and USB Type-C device to the TBT port.

8. Turning on the system

Connect the supplied power cord to the Power input on the system rear panel and then press the power switch on the front panel to turn on the system.

Installing drivers and software

Installing an operating system

Depending on the ZOTAC ZBOX model, the system may not ship with an operating system pre-installed. The user must install the operating system before the ZOTAC ZBOX can be used. The following operating systems are supported:

- Windows 11 64-bit

Follow the instructions below to install an operating system:

1. Attach the USB flash drive via USB 3.2 port.
2. Wait for the ZOTAC ZBOX to boot from the USB flash drive.
3. Follow the onscreen directions to install the operating system.
4. Install system drivers to gain full functionality of the ZOTAC ZBOX hardware and features.

Installing system drivers

Before you can use the full features of the ZOTAC ZBOX, the system drivers must be installed. The following types of operating systems are supported by the USB flash drive:

- Windows 11 64-bit

Follow the instructions below to install the system drivers:

1. Insert the USB flash drive. If autorun is enabled, the driver installation main menu will show up automatically. If autorun is disabled, you may click the file Launch.EXE to bring up the driver installation main menu.
2. The following drivers are available on the USB flash drive:
 - Intel Chipset Driver
 - Intel Graphics Driver
 - NVIDIA Graphics Driver
 - Realtek Ethernet PCI-E Driver
 - Bluetooth Driver
 - Intel Management Engine



- Intel Thunderbolt Driver
- Killer Network Driver
- BayHub_SD Driver

- ☞ Each driver must be installed individually to ensure proper operation of the ZOTAC ZBOX.
3. Select the driver you want to install. The driver installer should launch.
 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to install the drivers.
 5. Restart the system.

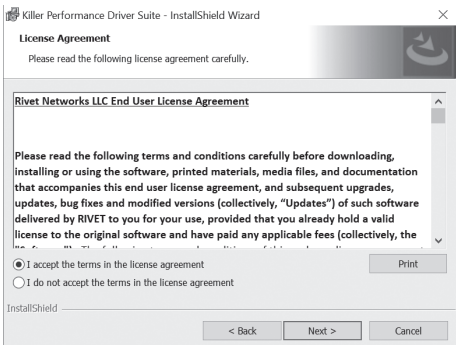
Installing the Killer Control Center

Before you can use the full feature of Killer LAN, please follow the instructions below to install the Killer Control Center.

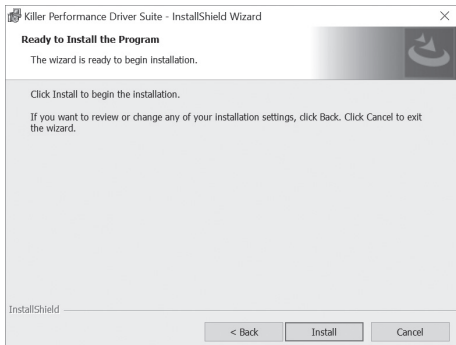
1. Run Killer Wireless Network Driver, click “Next” when the following dialog box displays.



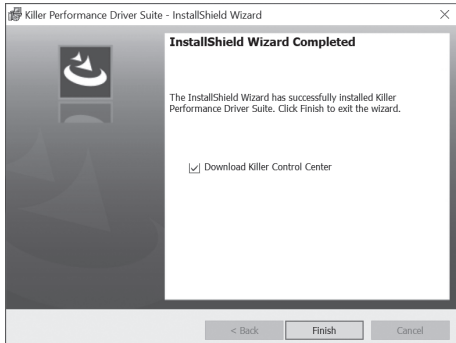
2. Accept the License agreement.



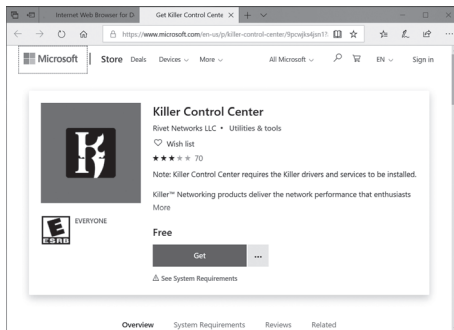
3. Click “Install” to begin the installation. (Please make sure that the network is connected before the installation)



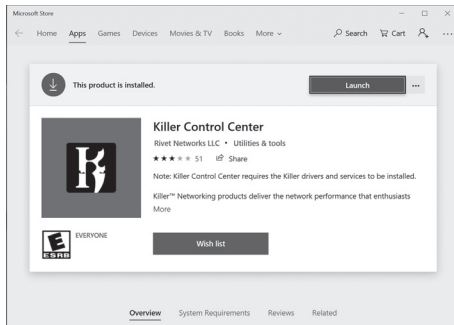
4. Check before “Download Killer Control Center”, and click “Finish”.

Using your ZOTAC ZBOX

Configuring a wireless connection

Please follow the instructions below to connect to a wireless network:

1. Double-click the wireless network icon (pic) in the notification area.
2. Select the wireless network you want to connect to from the list and click Connect.
3. After connection is established, you will see “Connected.”

Note 1: For security concerns, Do NOT connect to an unsecured network, otherwise, the transmitted information without encryption might be visible to others.

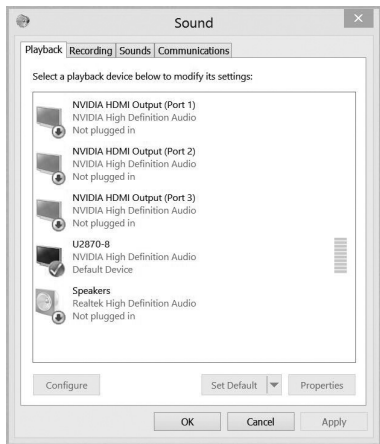
Note 2: Enter the network security key if necessary.



Configuring audio output

Follow the steps below to enable audio output when connecting the ZOTAC ZBOX to a TV or receiver via DP/HDMI adapter.

1. Access the Sound settings via the system Control Panel.
2. Under Playback devices, click the display device that corresponds with your audio compatible display.
3. Click the “Set Default” button in the lower right hand corner.
4. Click “OK” to exit the setup.
